COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday, March 6, 2024. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members: Jim Allison, Paige Bjorn, Norman Schippert, Emily Rademaker and Angelica Shea. Also, in attendance were City Attorney, John Singler, and city clerk Denise Haney

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Norman Schippert made a Motion to approve the February 2024 minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Angelica Shea seconded the motion, and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Open Comments – Residents of Maple Avenue expressed their various opinions regarding sidewalks on Maple Avenue. One resident stated that she did not feel a need for sidewalks due to drainage issues, losing mature trees, placements of utilities, maintenance of sidewalks, and if it is a public safety issue in response to speeding on Maple then that needs to be addressed specifically. As taxpayers, residents want to have a say about how tax money is spent, and residents have repeatedly voiced concerns about hiring a Pewee Valley police officer.

The mayor reiterated he would be happy to break down what would be required to hire an officer and that it has changed drastically since wages, retirement, and worker's compensation have increased and fewer officers are in the workforce. Another resident asked if something needed 100% approval from residents of a street for proposed projects, the council stated they do not, but a petition is necessary to gauge the interest of the residents regarding said project. Final approval ultimately comes from the council. Overall, the residents want to know what can be done as a community.

Council member Emily Rademaker shared this concern and spoke with the city and county officials who stated that the city is getting more police hours, better equipment and better overall coverage by contracting through Oldham County.

The mayor stated that all of the feedback is in response to hearsay on a Facebook page that is not the official city of Pewee Valley FB page or affiliated with official city business or projects.

Tom Clark asked for residents to participate in the Oldham County Bicentennial celebration recognizing Pewee Valley's uniqueness and amazing history and implored residents to purchase and read the new book and to check out the city's historical website.

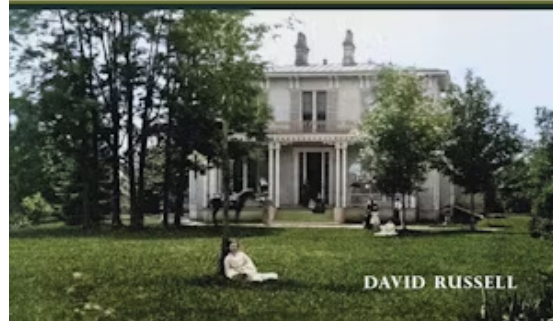

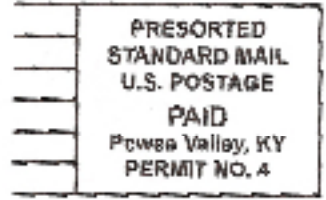
