MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL
March 2, 2015

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, March 2, 2015. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Rex Florence, Henry Walser, Will Chambers, Norman Schippert, Bethany Major, and Dick Filippini. Also in attendance were John Singler, City Attorney and Laura Eichenberger, City Clerk.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Henry Walser to approve the February 2, 2015 Minutes of the City Council Meetings as written. Norman Schippert seconded the motion and all Council Members voted in favor.

Public Safety—Dick Filippini

New signs have been installed beneath the stop signs at Mt. Mercy and Central Avenue to make it more clear that traffic on those roads has to yield to traffic on Highway 146. Three weight limit signs have been installed on Cherry and Maple Lanes.

Finance/Insurance/Storm Water—Rex Florence

The liability and property insurance is being renewed in March.

Communication/Website—Henry Walser

The Historical Society website is now live and linked through the City’s website.

Waste Management/Mowing—Will Chambers

Republic Services/Industrial Disposal (ID) did well in handling the trash pick-up around the snow storms. The recycling day has been changed to every other Friday (change effective February 27, 2015). ID mailed a post card and a 2015 pick-up calendar to those who participate in recycling.

Roads and Drainage/Environmental Board—Bob Rogers

Mayor Rogers thanked Glenn Rowland for doing a great job on the snow and ice removal.

The Environmental Board was unable in February to meet due to the snow. Mayor Rogers thanked the Kentucky Division of Forestry for a \$5,000 grant received. The next meeting is Monday, March 16th, 7 pm, at Town Hall.
