MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL
Monday, April 4, 2016

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, April 4, 2016. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Henry Walser, Rex Florence, Paige Bjorn, Norman Schippert, Bethany Major, and Dick Filippini. Also in attendance were John Singler, City Attorney and Laura Eichenberger, City Clerk.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Henry Walser to approve the March 7, 2016 Minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Rex Florence seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Financial Report

The Profit & Loss vs. Actual, and Balance Sheet through April 2, 2016 reports from the Treasurer were distributed in the Council Member meeting packets.

Open Comments – There was no response to the call for open comments.

Police Report

Chief Larimore reported March was a good month. There were no incidents to report.

Mayor Rogers thanked Oldham County for loaning the speed limit radar trailer to the City.

- The City will be working with the Lions Club in making sidewalk repairs along Highway 146.
- The City has applied for the 2016 Safety Grant through the Kentucky League of Cities.
- Mayor Rogers stated he is looking into applying for a FEMA grant for the Town Square drainage issue.

Council Member Reports

Town Hall/Festivities/Central Park—Bethany Major

Henry Walser obtained estimates from a contractor for repair work to be done on Town Hall. Specifically, rotted wood and water damage in the areas of the porch, cupola, gutters, and siding.

Bethany Major met with the landscaping contractor for the park. The landscaper is proposing planting tall white flowering shrubs behind the gazebo to define the edge of the park and as a backdrop for events in the gazebo.

Sidewalks—Norman Schippert

The Lions Club will help finance some of the sidewalk repairs to the sections from the City border near Kilgus to Ash Avenue. There will be an opportunity for citizens to contribute to a section of sidewalk that includes a dedication plaque.

Mayor Rogers noted there are also sections for sidewalk closer to Tuliphurst that need repair.

Mayor Rogers stated he spoke with the Transportation Cabinet today and was told the section of sidewalk from Foley to the County line would be done by the end of June.

Roads and Drainage/Environmental Board—Bob Rogers

There has been shoulder work completed on Wooldridge.

The annual Arbor Day Tree Give-Away is Saturday, April 30th, 10 am. The Pewee Valley Environmental Education Day is scheduled for Wednesday, May 11th. We expect about 90 4th and 5th grade students to participate.

New Business

The City has received its 21st year as a Tree City U.S.A. certification.

Arbor Day Proclamation

Mayor Rogers recited the Arbor Day Proclamation naming Saturday, April 30, 2015 as Arbor Day.

SRC Approved Changes of Land Development Code

Following some discussion, the Council agreed to table further discussion until the May 2, 2016 meeting.

Municipal Order: Republic Services/Industrial Disposal 2-Year Contract Extension

Republic Services/Industrial Disposal has offered a 2-year extension (through June 30, 2018) to the current contract at the current weekly curbside residential trash rate of \$10.20 per month, per home; the current bi-weekly recycling curbside service rate of \$3.05 per month, per home. The 2-year extension will include one change regarding recycling pick-up for 35 homes on determined streets that will be serviced once per month and provided with an additional 96-gallon cart. Those residents affected will be notified by Republic Services.

The contract provides residents: two trash carts and one 96 gallon recycle cart at no charge; weekly curbside trash pick-up; bi-weekly curbside recycle pick-up; monthly curbside recycle pick-up and two 96 gallon recycle carts for determined streets; and one bulk item per quarter at no charge.

A motion to approve a 2-year contract extension for waste and recycling services was made by Dick Filippini and seconded by Henry Walser. All Council Members voted in favor.

Special Event/Temporary Sign Permit Application: Dyslexia Dash, Sunday, October 2, 2016

The event coordinator has provided proof of liability insurance and map of route. The Council stipulated that the residents of Edgewood be notified of the route in writing.

A motion to approve the Special Event/Temporary Sign Permit for the Dyslexia Dash was made by Dick Filippini and seconded by Henry Walser. All Council Members voted in favor.

Permanent Sign Permit Application: St. James Episcopal Church Pre-School

A motion to approve the Permanent Sign Permit for St. James Episcopal Church Pre-School was made by Bethany Major and seconded by Henry Walser. All Council Members voted in favor.

Special Event/Temporary Sign Permit Application: Car Show (private event)

John Hudson, the tenant in the Herdt Motor Company building, will host a car show on Sunday, May 15, 2016, 1 pm to 4 pm, at 221 LaGrange Road and surrounding parking lots. The car show will correspond with the Concert in the Park featuring the Whiskey Bent Valley Boys. The Council agreed to approve temporary signage for the car show, clarifying that it is a private event and not City sponsored.

A motion to approve temporary signage for the car show was made by Rex Florence and seconded by Bethany Major. All Council Members voted in favor.

Henry Walser motioned to pay the bills. Rex Florence seconded the motion and all Council Members voted in favor.

Henry Walser motioned to adjourn the April 2, 2016 Meeting of the City Council, seconded by Paige Bjorn, with all Council Members present voting in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 7:44 pm.
