MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL
Monday, May 2, 2016

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, April 4, 2016. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Henry Walser, Rex Florence, Paige Bjorn, Norman Schippert, Bethany Major, and Dick Filippini. Also in attendance were John Singler, City Attorney and Laura Eichenberger, City Clerk.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Henry Walser to approve the April 4, 2016 Minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Dick Filippini seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Financial Report

The Profit & Loss vs. Actual, Profit & Loss vs. Comparison, and Balance Sheet through April 30, 2016 reports from the Treasurer were distributed in the Council Member meeting packets.

Roads and Drainage/Environmental Board/Mowing—Bob Rogers

The Mayor and the City Engineer will be evaluating roads and determine which will be paved next.

New Business

First Reading: Ordinance 2, Series 2016, Establishing a Budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017

John Singler presented the first reading of Ordinance 2, Series 2016, An Ordinance Establishing the Budget for the City of Pewee Valley for the Fiscal Year Beginning July 1, 2016 and Ending June 30, 2017.

Council Members Bethany Major, Henry Walser, and Mayor Rogers met with City Treasurer Stan Clark to work on the first draft of the budget and property tax rate.

A motion for introduction and first reading by summary of Ordinance 2, Series 2016 Fiscal Year 2016-2017 Budget by Norman Schippert and seconded by Bethany Major. All Council Members voted in favor.

First Reading: Ordinance 3, Series 2016, Establishing the Tax Rate for Fiscal Year 2016-2017.

The property tax rate for fiscal year 2016-2017 is 0.1439 per \$100 valuation of property assessed for taxation. A 10% early payment discount is offered for payments received prior to October 31, 2016.

A motion for introduction and first reading of Ordinance 3, Series 2016, An Ordinance Establishing the Tax Rate for Ad Valorem Taxes on Real Property for the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 in the City of Pewee Valley, Kentucky, and the Levy of an Ad Valorem Tax Thereon for the General Operation Purposes of the City for the Fiscal Year of July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017 was made by Norman Schippert and seconded by Bethany Major. All Council Members voted in favor.

Temporary Sign Permit: Crestwood Festival, June 18, 2016

Chief Larimore confirmed with the Project Chairman the request for a banner in the yard of The Dancer's Pointe and yard signs placed outside the right-of-way just prior to the event and to be removed right after the event.

Norman Schippert motioned to approve the temporary sign permit. Henry Walser seconded the motion and all Council Members voted in favor.

Temporary Sign Permit: St. Aloysius Country Picnic, July 16, 2016

A motion to approve the temporary sign permit was made by Henry Walser and seconded by Rex Florence. All Council Members voted in favor.

Temporary Sign Permit: St. James Church Plant Sale, May 14, 2016

A motion to approve the temporary sign permit was made by Henry Walser and seconded by Norman Schippert. All Council Members voted in favor.

Temporary Sign Permit: American Diabetes Association Tour de Cure, June 11, 2016

Henry Walser motioned to approve the temporary sign permit. Norman Schippert seconded the motion and all Council Members voted in favor.

Open Comments

Jason Nemes, candidate for State House of Representatives, introduced himself. He is running against incumbent Ron Crimm.

A motion was made by Henry Walser to pay the bills, seconded by Rex Florence. All Council Members voted in favor.

Henry Walser motioned to adjourn the May 2, 2016 Meeting of the City Council, seconded by Rex Florence, with all Council Members voting in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 pm.
