MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL
Monday, June 6, 2016

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, June 6, 2016. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Henry Walser, Rex Florence, Paige Bjorn, Norman Schippert, and Dick Filippini. Also in attendance were John Singler, City Attorney and Laura Eichenberger, City Clerk. Council Member Bethany Major was absent.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Henry Walser to approve the May 2, 2016 Minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Rex Florence seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Financial Report

The Profit & Loss vs. Actual, Profit & Loss vs. Comparison, and Balance Sheet through May 31, 2016 reports from the Treasurer were distributed in the Council Member meeting packets.

Open Comments

Bernie Lamp, 115 Edgewood, stated the railroad crossing at Central Avenue is rough. Mayor Rogers stated that CSX has been contacted about the crossing. Mayor Rogers also reported that CSX has finished replacing the pipe under the tracks near Wooldridge.

Police Report

Oldham County Police Officer, David Ingram, gave the police report on behalf of Chief Larimore, who was unable to attend.

The Oldham County 911 Central Dispatch is raising awareness of house number identification to improve response time of emergency professionals. House numbers should be a minimum of 3” and displayed where easily seen.

The State has completed the sidewalk from Foley Avenue to the Jefferson County line.

Second Reading, Ordinance, 3, Series 2016, Fiscal Year 2016/2017 Tax Rate

City Attorney, John Singler presented the second reading of Ordinance 3, Series 2016, Fiscal Year 2016/2017 Tax Rate by summary. The ordinance proposes to keep the same tax rate at 0.1439 per \$100. The early payment discount is 10%.

A motion to adopt Ordinance 3, Series 2016, An Ordinance Establishing the Tax Rate for Ad Valorem Taxes on Real Property for the Fiscal Year 2016-2017 in the City of Pewee Valley, Kentucky, and the Levy of an Ad Valorem Tax Thereon for the General Operation Purposes of the City for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2016 to June 30, 2017, was made by Norman Schippert and seconded by Rex Florence.
