MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL  
Wednesday, September 7, 2016

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday, September 7, 2016. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Henry Walser, Rex Florence, Paige Bjorn, and Norman Schippert. Also in attendance were John Singler, City Attorney and Laura Eichenberger, City Clerk. Council Members Bethany Major and Dick Filippini were absent.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Henry Walser to approve the August 1, 2016 Minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Paige Bjorn seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

### **Financial Report**

The Profit & Loss vs. Comparison and Balance Sheet reports through August 31, 2016 from the Treasurer were distributed in the Council Member meeting packets. Mayor Rogers stated the 2016 Property Tax bills have been mailed, and the fiscal year 2015/2016 audit is in progress.

### **Open Comments**

Maureen Bishop stated how nice Town Hall looks and appreciates the restoration work being done.

A Wooldridge Drive resident asked about a subdivision going in on Dr. Applegate's property. Mayor Rogers directed her to call Oldham County Planning & Zoning at 222-1476 or him directly at 241-7340.

Doreen Goodwin introduced herself. Judge Goodwin is the current Family Court Judge, for Oldham, Trimble, and Henry Counties. Family court includes divorce, custody, child support, neglect, abuse, adoptions, dependency, and termination of parental rights. Michael Pate introduced himself and is also running for Family Court Judge. Mr. Pate has practiced for 35 years in Family Court representing men, woman, and children.

Jason Nemes, Attorney, introduced himself and is running for State Representative. Please consider him when voting on November 8<sup>th</sup>.

Chief Larimore reported that things have been good in Pewee Valley for the last month. There is the continual problem with drivers running stop signs and speeding. **Announcements**

- Mayor Rogers announced Dale Shields was the first resident to pay the 2016 Pewee Valley Property Tax.
- Mayor Rogers thanked the Pewee Valley Fire Department and everyone for the Summer Picnic. It was a huge success. The sponsors did a fantastic job by donating more so than in the past.
- Mayor Rogers thanked Glenn Rowland for his help during the flash flood last week when water flooded over the Park bridge and Central Avenue.

Roads and Drainage—Bob Rogers

The Kentucky State Municipal Emergency Road Aid fund has reimbursed the City the \$3,307 for repairing the sinkhole at Rosswood and Ridgewood Drives.

Mayor Rogers reported he has contacted the Transportation Cabinet requesting engineers review the intersection of Ash Avenue and Old Floydsburg Road in an effort to help prevent accidents.

Public Hearing: Proposed Road Fund Expenditures

City Attorney John Singler stated that the City collects \$25,500 from the State Municipal Road Aid fund to spend on road repairs and resurfacing. The City projects spending that amount in roads and drainage in the fiscal year July 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017.

Mayor Rogers stated Maple and Tulip Avenues will be planed down and resurfaced. The City received six bids resulting in Ohio Valley Asphalt being the lowest bid of \$71,682 and Flynn Brothers the highest at \$92,792. The City was able to piggy-back on the County's asphalt bids in order to get the lowest price. The work is to be completed by the end of October.

In addition, all the salt for winter weather has been purchased.

Peace Lane resident, John Connell asked about the Peace and Muirs Lane intersection that deteriorates and widens with traffic. Mr. Connell asked if tightening that corner would alleviate some of the traffic. Mayor Rogers stated Muirs Lane is usually re-graveled twice a year at about \$1,200 each time. When the City Engineer is able Mayor Rogers will arrange a time to meet and review possible solutions.

#### Town Hall/Central Park/Festivities

Mayor Rogers reported the restoration work of Town Hall is going well.

The painting by Annie Fellow Johnson's step-daughter donated by Charles and Alice Booker is now hanging in the Town Hall meeting room.

Norman Schippert reported the sidewalk repair work along Highway 146 from Locust Lane to Ash Avenue has been completed.

#### **New Business**

Special Event/Temporary Sign Permit: Arts & Crafts Day in Pewee Valley, October 22, 2016. Council Member Henry Walser motioned to approve the permit. Norman Schippert seconded, and all Council Members voted in favor.

Special Event/Temporary Sign Permit: CASA Superhero 5k Run/Walk, October 29, 2016. A motion was made by Henry Walser to approve the permit, seconded by Paige Bjorn and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Special Event/Temporary Sign Permit: St. Aloysius events 2016 through 2017: Night at the Races, November 12, 2016; Trivia Night, January 28, 2016; Fish Fries, March 1, 3, 10, 17, 24, 27, 2016; Picnic, July 15, 2017; Arts & Crafts, October 28, 2017 (date not

confirmed). A motion was made by Rex Florence to approve the permit with the stipulation that the wooden sign posts are painted white. The motion was seconded by Norman Schippert and all Council Members present voted in favor.

A motion was made by Henry Walser to pay the bills, seconded by Paige Bjorn. All Council Members present voted in favor.

Henry Walser motioned to adjourn the September 7, 2016 Meeting of the City Council, seconded by Norman Schippert, with all Council Members present voting in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 7:20 pm.
