

CITY OF PEWEE VALLEY
MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL
October 6, 2014

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, October 6, 2014. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Rex Florence, Will Chambers, Norman Schippert, Bethany Major, and Dick Filippini. Also in attendance were John Singler, City Attorney and Laura Eichenberger, City Clerk. Council Member Henry Walser was absent.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Dick Filippini to approve the September 3, 2014 Minutes of the City Council Meetings as written. Rex Florence seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Financial Report

The Profit Loss Year-to-Date Budget vs. Actual and Balance Sheet reports through September 2014 from the City Treasurer were distributed to Council Members.

Mayor Rogers announced the Fiscal Year 13/14 Audit report will be given at the November 3rd Council Meeting.

Open Comments

Mike Turner, 116 Rollington Road, presented a petition for speed hump installation on Rollington Road between Central Avenue and 112 Rollington Road. The petition cites frustration at average driving speeds exceeding the speed limit by non-residents cutting through from Westport Road to Highway 22. The petition contains 19 signatures of residents at 14 addresses between Central Avenue and 138 Rollington Road.

A motion to have the City Engineer, Mel Milburn, review the speed hump request was made by Bethany Major and seconded by Will Chambers. All Council Members present voted in favor. A follow-up for Council discussion will be included on the November 3rd Agenda.

Police Report

Chief Larimore reminds residents we are approaching the Holiday season when thefts are more likely to take place. Please be sure to lock cars and put your valuables away. Residents are encouraged to submit a House Watch form when going out-of-town.

Chief Larimore reported he has contacted the State regarding installing stop bars at the intersection of Central Avenue and Rosswood Drive. The State will not install stop bars

as there have been no fatalities or major collisions at that location. It is possible the State may allow the City to install stop bars (to their specifications) at the City's expense.

Announcements

- The Oldham County Library is hosting a Meet & Greet the Candidates and Visit with State and County Officials, Wednesday October 15th, 308 Yager Avenue, LaGrange, 6:00 pm to 7:30 pm.
- Mayor Rogers thanked the State Municipal Road Aid for reimbursement from the emergency road fund for sinkhole repair. The State contributed \$3,000. The total cost of the repair was \$3,500.
- The number of visitors to the Pewee Valley Museum has increased in the past couple of months.
- The current list of Children in Crisis needs is available on the city's website and in the *Call of the Pewee*. The Holidays are coming up and kids need coats, winter outerwear, sheets, detergent, toilet paper, paper towels, etc. We're a generous community and there are still people out there who need help.
- Core Drilling on Mt. Mercy Drive has been scheduled for Saturday, October 18th. All businesses affected have been notified. JRA Architects will make their presentation of Town Square plans at the November 3rd meeting.
- The PREP List form is in the *Call of the Pewee*.
- Arts & Crafts Day in Pewee Valley will be held Saturday, October 25th, 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Booths will be at the Woman's Club, Pewee Valley Presbyterian Church, and St. James Episcopal Church. A Concert in the Park featuring The Sound Endeavors will start at Noon to 3:00 p.m. (weather permitting).

Pewee Valley Fire District Board of Directors Report

The new firehouse on Ash Avenue has received the Certificate of Occupancy. There will be an open house on Sunday, October 26th, 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Council Member Reports

Sidewalks—Norman Schippert

Mayor Rogers reported there is a Safety Grant from the Kentucky League of Cities that includes sidewalk repair.

Festivities/Town Hall/Central Park—Bethany Major

Bethany Major stated the Movie Night and Pumpkin Decorating in the Park was another great success. More and more residents are coming to the event and we have more requests to have Movie Night monthly. Also, the Whiskey Bent Valley Boys Concert in the Park had a great turnout.

The date for this year's Yule Log will be set next month.

The Pewee Valley Historical Committee met this month. They are still working on the clean-up of the African American Cemetery (Pewee Valley Cemetery East).

Roads and Drainage—Bob Rogers

The last order of salt/minerals for winter has been delivered.

New Business

Electronics Recycle Drop-Off—Dick Filippini

On Sunday, November 1st, 8 a.m. to 11 a.m., residents will be able to drop off old electronic items at Town Hall for recycling. The Bluegrass E-Cycle Company will pick-up the items and recycle them properly.

Old Business

2nd Reading: Ordinance 6, Series 2014, Amending Sections of Chapter 152 of the City Ordinance Regarding Signs

John Singler presented the second reading of the Sign Ordinance Amendment. There are two changes to the ordinance. First, is the addition of wording to recognize inclusion of Special Event Permits (Walks/Runs on City streets allowing for directional signs in the right-of-way). The second change is to require any kind of signage to be subject to the review process (the exemption has been removed), even if the sign is not in the right-of-way. There has been good response in compliance with submitting the Special Event Permit Requests.

A motion to adopt Ordinance 6, Series 2014 An Ordinance Amending Sections of Chapter 152 of the City Ordinances Regarding Signs was made by Dick Filippini. The Motion was seconded by Norman Schippert.
