MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL
Monday, October 1
2018

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, October 1, 2018. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Rex Florence, Paige Bjorn, Bethany Major and Michele Pisano. Also, in attendance were Attorney, Carrie Ritsert and clerk Denise Haney.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

A motion was made by Rex Florence to approve the September 2018 Minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Paige Bjorn seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Financial report – Rex Florence presented the updated financial report to the Council.

Open Comments – Mr. Zaring expressed his concern about pedestrian safety while walking on LaGrange Rd between Tulip and Ash Avenues, visibility is poor for cars pulling out of Ash Ave. onto LaGrange Rd, and cars parking at the businesses in that area have been impeding the sidewalk. Council candidate Todd Jones introduced himself to the Mayor, residents and council members. Leslee Lamp reminded everyone of the Meet-The-Candidates night hosted by the Pewee Valley Women’s Club on Thursday, October 18th at 7pm. Mr. Williams asked to be briefed about the Rest Cottage project.
