## COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, August 5, 2019. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Henry Walser, Norman Schippert, Michele Pisano, Bethany Major, and Paige Bjorn. Also, in attendance were City Attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

A Motion was made by Henry Walser to approve the July 1, 2019 minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Paige Bjorn seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

**Financial Report-** No report.

**Open Comments** - Residents of Old Forest presented the case for another speed hump be added to the street and expressed their concerns about the speeding on Ash Ave, Old Floydsburg and Old Forest especially now that school has started. Council members asked that this be determined a public safety issue and formal protocol be put in place, including revisiting the traffic and speeding survey that was previously taken, before another traffic study be done and adding another speed hump. Chief Larimore reiterated that the roads within the city have addressed the speeding concerns, including flashing lights at stop signs and trimming back trees and bushes for visibility, based on previous traffic studies and feedback from residents. Residents would like additional traffic monitoring.

Robyn O'Bryan thanked the Mayor for the efforts regarding the progress of the sidewalk on Ash Avenue.

**Public Safety-** Michele Pisano reminded residents that school is back in session so be aware of increased pedestrian and car traffic and mind the speed limit. Michele asked the Mayor and council if a process can be instituted to address the public safety issues fairly and equitably. The Mayor would like an additional traffic study done on Old Forest and after data is collected the issue

will be revisited. City attorney John Singler suggests adopting an order that will address public safety issues for the city in a consistent and uniform manner.

**Insurance/Storm Water-** No report.

**Communication** – Henry Walser congratulated the 314 Exchange on the acquisition of a liquor license and the success of their first events.

**Sidewalks** - Norman Schippert -Federal funding has been approved for Ash Avenue sidewalk. Next step is to meet with engineers.

**Festivities/Historical/Central Park** – Bethany Major thanked everyone for their help with the summer picnic. Check the calendar for events.

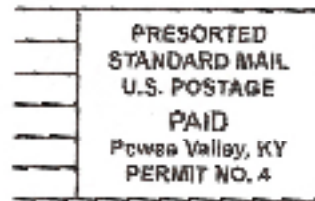
