Monday February 1st 2021

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Monday, February 1, 2021. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members, Paige Bjorn, Henry Walser, Bethany Major, Norman Schippert, Emily Rademaker, William Frentz, city attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney.

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

Mayor Rogers announced that after 8 years of serving the city, Chief Larimore will be leaving. The Mayor thanked Chief Larimore for his professionalism and impeccable service. Chief Greg is being replaced by officer Mark Hoskins.

Motion to approve January 2021 minutes made by Henry Walser, seconded by Paige Bjorn and approved by all members of the council.

**Financial Report** – Balance sheets for end of 2020 were presented. 98% of property taxes have been collected.

**Sidewalks/Festivities** – Emily Rademaker stated that she and Mayor Rogers met with Chris Crumpton, the city engineer, and Albert Zimmerman, the project manager, about the Ash Avenue

sidewalk project. They confirmed that all the necessary documents have been submitted, and once the approvals are finalized, we could move forward with bids. Albert Zimmerman will draw up the bids when needed. Two of the encroachment permits were approved this month. Bollards, upright vehicle barriers, were installed around the new clock in the town square. The Monarchs have been booked for August 7th for the Summer Picnic. Yule Log event will be held on December 5th. The city will consider scheduling additional events including Environmental Day, Movie in the Park, Fall Festival and Tree Give Away, but like everything else, these plans are subject to change due to Pandemic.

**Town Hall/Historical/Central Park** – No report

Motion to approve Ordinance 1, Series 2021 was made by Paige Bjorn, seconded by Norman Schippert, and roll call vote was taken. Council split 3 to 3 and the Mayor voted in favor of the Ordinance, breaking the tie and adopting the Ordinance.
