MINUTES OF CITY COUNCIL

Wednesday March 1, 2023

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday, March 1, 2023. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members: Henry Walser, Jim Allison, Norman Schippert, and Emily Rademaker. Also in attendance were City Attorney, John Singler and city clerk Denise Haney

Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 6:30 PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Henry Walser made a Motion to approve the February 2023 minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Jim Allison seconded the motion, and all Council Members present voted in favor.

The Pewee Valley Fire Dept. reports they made 24 calls for service in February, 13 EMS and 11 fire calls and 4 of the 11 were within city limits. The Fire Dept currently has 5 new recruits and once recruiting is complete the OC “active members” will be 31.

Announcements – City engineer Garrett Dean will have a meeting with AT&T regarding fiber optic installation in the city. The mayor thanked LG&E for removing a tree on Mt. Mercy. The city of Pewee Valley is again recognized as a Tree City USA, Mayor Rogers thanked the tree board for their work. The city will work with Oldham County to install flock cameras in the city to address stolen vehicles and other traffic violations. St. Al’s is addressing the traffic issue regarding the fish fry by adding another line in the drive thru and not allowing people to stop on the shoulder so cars can pass.
