In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members, Paige Bjorn, Henry Walser, William Frentz, Bethany Major, Emily Rademaker and Norman Schippert. Also, in attendance were City Attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney. Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

A motion to approve the October 2021 minutes was made Henry Walser, seconded by Paige Bjorn and all council members voted in favor

**Financial Report** - Updated financial sheets were presented. Approximately 70 percent of 2021 taxes have been paid to date.


#### **Events**
