COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday, September 9, 2020. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members Paige Bjorn, Henry Walser, Michele Pisano, Norman Schippert, city attorney John Singler and clerk Denise Haney. Mayor Rogers called the meeting to order at 7:00 PM and led in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag

Henry Walser made a motion to approve the August 3, 2020 minutes of the City Council Meeting as written. Paige Bjorn seconded the motion and all Council Members present voted in favor.

Financial Report- 2020 property taxes have been mailed.

Open Comments – A resident asked about the application for short term rentals. It is posted on the Oldham County Fiscal Court website and will be posted on the city website.

Police Report – Drivers please be aware of people walking and cyclists obey the rules of the road. Please walk single file on the road. Please be mindful of kids and school buses once school begins and obey speed limits.

Announcements – October 3rd is the tree-giveaway in Central Park. The MS4 audit was completed and everything was in compliance. The Town Square renovation project is complete and Mt. Mercy will open.

Council Member Reports

Public Safety – The burn ban is still in effect. If you see any problems, such as light outages, signs damaged etc. please call Town Hall or Chief Larimore. Household Hazardous Waste collection is Saturday, Oct. 3rd at Oldham County Fairgrounds.

Insurance/Storm Water- No report.

Communication – No report

Sidewalks – Minor details are being worked out for the Ash Avenue sidewalk project. The project will soon be sent out for bids.

Festivities/Historical/Central Park – During the tree-giveaway the Historical Society will be selling items celebrating the Sesquicentennial including t-shirts.

Waste Management – No report.

Roads – Mayor Rogers – Libs Paving will be resurfacing Mt. Mercy Place and Ridgewood.

New Business – Attorney John Singler summarized the Franchise agreement with cable television cable services (Spectrum) and the city of Pewee Valley. A motion to approve the extended franchise agreement was made by Norman Schippert, and Henry Walser seconded the motion, and all council members present voted in favor. John Singler summarized the allocation of federal funds presented to the City through the Cares Act.

He presented by summary Municipal Order 2, Series 2020 a Municipal Order announcing the city of Pewee Valley’s determination to use the Cares Funding granted to the City to establish a small business and non-profit relief fund to assist those that have been financially impacted by COVID-19. A motion to accept the order was made by Henry Walser, seconded by Norman Schippert and all council members voted in favor.

Preliminary plans to expand Friendship Manor Health and Rehab were presented to the Mayor and council. These plans can be viewed at Town Hall during normal business hours.

John Singler presented by summary Ordinance 6, Series 2020, an Ordinance adopting the Supplement to the Code of Ordinances. A motion for First Reading of Ordinance 6 was made by Henry Walser, seconded by Paige Bjorn and all council members voted in favor.


Upon approval of outstanding bills, the Council voted unanimously to adjourn.

Historical Note

The Sweet Shop at 301 LaGrange Road is situated in Pewee Valley's small historic commercial center. Completely renovated in 1977, it features commercial space on the first floor and living quarters above that have been turned into offices.

It was originally built in 1905 by William H. Smith, son of William A. Smith, for Tom McAllister, who planned to use it for commercial rental. Smith was McAllister's father-in-law.

Although many different businesses have been housed here over the past century, the longest-lived was a Sweet Shop, run at various times by the Bossungs, Sayeaters, and Millions, according to an interview with Louise Herdt "Sis" Marker conducted by Carol Tobe in 1981.

In 1910, the second floor of the building was remodeled to accommodate the newly-formed Pewee Valley Masonic Lodge. The lodge met here for about two years, until 1912, when W.N. Jurey rebuilt his store after a spectacular fire (now the Little Colonel Playhouse) and added another story specifically for the lodge.





Once the grants have been awarded, the names of businesses and the amount they were awarded will be published on our website to ensure full transparency.

The Pewee Valley CARES Grant program will be operated on an equal access/ non-preferential (i.e. first-come first-serve basis). Once the funds allocated by the City of Pewee Valley for this grant program are awarded, no additional applications will be considered.

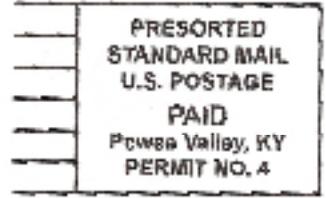
