Wednesday September 9, 2021

The regular meeting of the City Council of Pewee Valley, Kentucky was held on Wednesday, September 9, 2021. In attendance were Mayor Bob Rogers, Council Members, Paige Bjorn, Henry Walser, Bethany Major, William Frentz and Emily Rademaker. A motion to approve the August 2021 minutes was made Henry Walser, seconded by Paige Bjorn and all council members voted in favor.
